What Is an Electronic Prescription?

Electronic prescriptions allow your civilian (non-DHA) provider to send your prescription directly to a Military Treatment Facility (MTF) Pharmacy.

- No more carrying paper prescriptions
- Quicker and more secure process
- Easier access to medications for Space-Available patients

What to Tell Your Provider

Ask your provider to electronically send your prescription to: “DOD Tripler ePhcy”

- Tripler Army Medical Center is the main entry point for these prescriptions.

Will My Local MTF Have My Medication?

Due to formulary and inventory limitations, please verify with your pharmacy staff to confirm if your medication is available at your local MTF.

- Some medications may also have restrictions (such as prior authorization) that can affect availability.

How Electronic Prescriptions Work

1. Your provider sends the prescription securely and electronically.
2. The MTF Pharmacy receives and processes it.
3. You pick up your medication when it’s ready—no paper needed!
