Captain Jenny S. Burkett is a native of Roanoke, Va., and entered the Navy in May 1997 from Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps at the University of Virginia, where she earned a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree. She reported to Naval Medical Center San Diego in June 1997.

Upon arrival at Naval Medical Center San Diego, she reported to Inpatient Internal Medicine, where she served as staff nurse. She transferred to the Intensive Care Unit in January 2000, to begin her critical care nursing practice. She transferred to US Naval Hospital Okinawa, Japan, in May 2001, where she served for two years as staff nurse, Special Care Unit, completed a Master in Business Administration from Touro University International, and obtained national certification as a Critical Care Registered Nurse.
